## Tell Senators to vote NO on SB 983

On 2/16/17 Maryland's highest court revised Maryland courts' rules to reduce our nationally notorious overuse of money bail which, today, keeps thousands of low-income--and, especially, African-American Marylanders in pretrial detention. (See Baltimore Sun editorial and the Washington Post article).

One month later, Maryland's Senate, whose leaders receive some of the largest campaign contributions of any U.S. legislators, will vote Monday morning on SB 983-- a bill that seeks to cancel the Maryland Court's new Rule to allow release conditions for low-income Marylanders. SB 983 seeks to safeguard bail bondsmen's stranglehold on Maryland's low-income pretrial population and to ensure there is "no preference" for nonfinancial release.
