

- 6 (3) the Division of Correction to expand treatment and programming within
  7 correctional institutions for substance abuse treatment, mental health treatment,
  8 cognitive-behavioral programming, and other evidence-based interventions for offenders;
- 9 (4) the Division of Parole and Probation to expand treatment and 10 programming in the community to include day reporting centers, mental health treatment, 11 cognitive-behavioral programming, and other evidence-based interventions for offenders; 12 and
- 13 <u>(5)</u> the State unit responsible for the improvement of the collection of 14 restitution as determined under Sections 12 and 13 of this Act.
- SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1, 2017, the Maryland Mediation and Conflict Resolution Office shall study and identify best practices for criminal referrals to mediation, based on experiences across the State and research, and submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Justice Reinvestment Oversight Board, the Governor, and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1, 2018,
   the State Commission on Criminal Sentencing Policy shall study how more alternatives to
   incarceration may be included in the sentencing guidelines and shall submit a report of the
   findings and recommendations to the Justice Reinvestment Oversight Board, the Governor,
   and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
- SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of Health and
   Mental Hygiene, the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, and the Department
   of Public Safety and Correctional Services shall:
