## Please urge the Governor to approve these "Smart-On-Crime" bills!

Maryland General Assembly in 2022 has passed and, so far, has sent to the Governor's desk a number of "smart-on-crime" bills that can reduce the amount of incarceration and costs while improving outcomes and public safety. Here are three MAJR priority bills that we hope the Governor will approve and not veto:

- 1. **HB0459/SB0691-Juvenile Justice Reform** This bill restricts juvenile court's jurisdiction to the most serious cases for children at age 13, limits the duration of juvenile probation to three years for the most serious cases, and creates a Commission to study best and most cost-effective, evidence-based practices for juvenile offenders' diversion and rehabilitation.
- 2. **SB0053 Child Interrogation Protection** This bill requires that police contact parents (or guardians) about a child's arrest and provides that an attorney also should advise the child of his or her rights in understandable language. Without such protections, studies show <u>children give false confessions</u> at a rate 3x higher than adults.
- 3. **HB 1 / HB0837 Cannabis Legalization** Like America's longrepealed prohibition of alcohol, marijuana criminalization has resulted in widespread harm from tainted products, incarceration (3x the rate for blacks compared to whites), gang-controlled sales, and more. HB 1 would put legalization on the election ballot. HB 837 would make sure that legalized cannabis was regulated safely, kept away from juveniles, taxed to support public services, and produced income for black as well as white businesses.

The Governor should be reminded that simply increasing prison time doesn't fix crime. Prevention and treatment, instead, can make our communities safer.
